## **Better Budgets - six years on**

Six years ago, CIOT, the Institute for Government and the Institute for Fiscal Studies published a joint report: 'Better Budgets: making tax policy better'.

Based on extensive interviews with tax policy stakeholders, the report concluded that the tax policy-making process was seriously flawed and that – to reduce taxpayer confusion, cut down costly errors and avoid embarrassing U-turns – the government should overhaul how it makes tax and budget decisions.

Six years on, as Jeremy Hunt prepares to present his first Budget, the three institutes are holding a joint event to look back on the conclusions we reached and the recommendations we made. Did we identify the right problems and solutions? Have there been any improvements in tax policymaking since then? And have any new problems or unexpected solutions appeared?
